

<u>Cultural Requirements – Anguloa</u>

Pronounced: An-gyoo-LOW-ah Tribe: Cymbidieae | Subtribe: Maxillariinae

These plants can grow quite large, with pseudobulbs reaching over 9 inches and leaves growing over 4 ft and shedding each new growth season. Either white with up to six inflorescence/bulb or yellow/red with up to twelve in late spring and early summer.

Temperature: Mostly high elevation. Thriving in cooler temperatures and good air movement. Tolerating intermediate as well.

Lighting: Thrives in almost direct sun during summer and requires ample sunlight in winter, minding temperatures.

Watering: Regularly during the growing season



for optimal flowering. Dry winter rest is beneficial, with minimal watering to prevent shriveling. Heavy watering when new growth appears in spring.

Fertilizer: Apply full-strength with each watering during new growth formation to promote large, mature pseudobulbs by fall.
