

<u>Cultural Requirements – Brassavola</u>

Pronounced: bra-sah-VOH-luh | Tribe: Epidendreae | Subtribe: Laeliinae



Often referred to as 'the lady of the night' due to its sweet scent, this genus with its effortless growth pattern, long-lasting flowers, and fragrance is a great addition to any collection. 20 species acknowledged as of 06/09 found in Tropical America, spanning from Mexico to the West Indies.

Temperature: Warm; Keep above 60-65F

Lighting: Good light; 2400-3600 footcandles

Watering: Heavily during active cycle, decreasing slightly after new growths are complete.

Fertilizer: Weekly or Bi-weekly during active growth; once a month during rest period. Flush monthly to prevent fertilizer salt accumulation.

Potting: Pots or hanging baskets with any good, airy epiphytic mix
