

## <u>Cultural Requirements – Bulbophyllum</u>

Pronounced: bulb-oh-FILLum

Tribe: Dendrobieae | Subtribe: Bulbophyllinae



Considered to be the largest group of orchids with over 2000 species. Known for its small to medium-sized creeping epiphytes, in a diverse array of flower shapes and sizes with a notable hinged lip.

**Temperature:** Mostly warm growing and should be kept above 65F at night. Species from temperate regions can reach 60-55F

**Lighting:** Thrives in bright light (2000 - 3500 foot-candles) with better and more frequent blooms in high light safe for the leaves.

**Watering:** Frequently. Mounted plants requiring daily watering and potted plants several times a week. Humidity kept above 60% is ideal.

**Fertilizer:** Use a balanced fertilizer at quarter strength weekly during summer, reducing to once a month in winter.

**Potting:** Generally prefers minimal repotting.
