

<u>Cultural Requirements – Eria</u>

Pronounced: EAR-ee-a | Tribe: Podochileae | Subtribe: Eriinae

Named for the wooly appearance of the flowers, which though not big, are generally produced in abundance. Blooms are short-lived. Species of this genus are distributed throughout Southeast Asia, from India to the islands of the Pacific.

Temperature: Cool to warm. 75-85F (day) 60-70F (night)



Lighting: Bright, indirect light for at least six hours

Watering: Maintain even moisture and high humidity with constant air movement

Fertilizer: Balanced fertilizer half-strength weekly during the growing season. Twice a month in cooler weather.

Potting: Recommend growing in a medium that does not completely dry out and repotting every 2-3 years when the pot becomes overcrowded.
