

## <u>Cultural Requirements – Leptotes</u>

Pronounced: lep-TOE-teez | Tribe: Epidendreae |

Subtribe: Laeliinae

A group of small species, named for their delicateness. They have small pseudobulbs, form tight clumps, and produce proportionally large flowers. Notably, Leptotes bicolor's seed capsules were once used for ice cream flavoring. 8 species recognized (2007), native to Brazil, Argentina, and Paraguay.



**Temperature:** Cool to warm. 60-75F, tolerating higher summer temperatures with adequate watering

**Lighting:** Bright light with some midday shade.

**Watering:** Water heavily during active growth and less during dormancy, allowing media or mount to approach dryness between. Humidity should be kept above 50%

**Fertilizer:** Use a balanced fertilizer year-round, adjusting the amount based on watering frequency.

**Potting:** While they can be potted in well-drained media, their semi-pendant nature makes them better suited for mounting.
