

<u>Cultural Requirements – Lysudamuloa</u>

Pronounced: EAR-ee-a | Tribe: Podochileae | Subtribe: Eriinae



Named for the wooly appearance of the flowers, which though not big, are generally produced in abundance. Blooms are short-lived. Species of this genus are distributed throughout Southeast Asia, from India to the islands of the Pacific.

Temperature: Cool to warm. 75-85F (day) 60-70F

(night)

Lighting: Dappled or indirect light.

Watering: Thrives with regular watering during growth, less water as growths mature to promote bud formation.

Fertilizer: Balanced fertilizer during growing season. Reduce fertilization when growths mature.

Potting: Recommend growing in a medium that does not completely dry out and repotting every 2-3 years when the pot becomes overcrowded.
