

Cultural Requirements – Macodes

Pronounced: ma-KO-deez Tribe: Erythrodeae | Subtribe: Goodyerinae



A genus of 'Jewel Orchids' known for its beautiful veined foliage and named for its elongated midlobe of the lip. A terrestrial orchid, closely related to Ludisia and Goodyera, 12 species are found from Malaysia to the Pacific Islands of Solomon and Vanuatu, thriving in low to medium elevation rainforests.

Temperature: Warm to intermediate depending on species origin.

Lighting: Adequate shade is recommended throughout the entire year.

Watering: 40-60% humidity; plants should be kept evenly moist throughout the year, never drying out completely.

Fertilizer: Apply a balanced fertilizer on a monthly basis.

Potting: Shallow pots or pans optimal, considering the creeping nature of the plants.
